UPDATED Vetting Student Assessments for Quality

With the advent of PERA, the need for quality assessments has been given renewed attention. The quality of teacher-created assessments may vary widely within a school/school district. Vetting assessments for quality and consistency is time-consuming for administrators who already find their time shrinking with the additional requirements in the teacher evaluation process.

The DuPage Regional Office of Education is prepared to help schools/school districts meet this challenge. We offer a service which reviews teacher-created assessments providing feedback on: **validity and reliability; format options; effective rubric construction; determining depth of knowledge; and documenting evidence of student growth.** The process we use helps to build capacity so teachers and administrators can continue this work through PLC's and/or Building Leadership Teams. KIDS Overview-By the 40th day of school in fall 2017, after gathering observations on at least 14 different readiness measures, all Illinois public school kindergarten teachers will report on each child's level of readiness. Many districts already have implemented KIDS, some for as many as three years. To date, KIDS has been piloted in classrooms serving 50,000 children.

NEW JCC Bomb Threats: Teen Suspect Arrested in Israel

March 23, 2017- "A Jewish teenager was arrested Thursday in connection with a series of bomb threats that have rattled Jewish institutions and community centers across the US and other countries," Israeli police said.

A month's-long international investigation led to the 19-year-old suspect, who used "advanced camouflage technologies" to cover his tracks, police spokesman Micky Rosenfeld said.

The suspect holds dual American-Israeli citizenship, an Israeli security official told CNN. He was arrested in Israel after an undercover investigation with the FBI.
