

Gifted Education Seminar

Overview:

The Gifted Education Seminar is a 45-hour course of study. The Illinois State Board of Education invites classroom teachers to deepen their understanding of how to teach and reach gifted and talented students. The interactive, multi-module course provides a sound foundation for supporting high-ability/high-potential learners. Identification and characteristics of the gifted learner will be explored in depth. The necessary components of programming, curriculum models and differentiation will be stressed. Interwoven throughout the course are issues dealing with diversity, equity and underserved populations. The seminar incorporates initial Knowledge and Skill Standards for Gifted and Talented Education from the Illinois Association for Gifted Children (IAGC) and the National Association for Gifted Children (NAGC). *The GES is an overview course and not included as a required course for the Gifted Education Endorsement.
