“Rebound”

Information Sheet for School Personnel

“Rebound” Definition: In response to SB 100 – *“students who are suspended out-of-school for longer than four school days must be provided appropriate and available support services during the period of their suspension”* (105 ILCS5/10-22.6 b-25), the DuPage Regional Office of Education Suspension Intervention Program named “Rebound” is provided in collaboration with DuPage Schools.

“Rebound” Components:

- “Rebound” supports students in grades 6-12 during a suspension of four or more days with academic instruction continuity while promoting restorative practices teaching conflict resolution and strengthening social emotional skills.
- Location is at the Center for Student Success (CSS) – 848 N. Mill Rd. Addison. CSS also houses ALOP (Alternative Learning Opportunities Program) DuPage.
- A district referral form and process will include infraction, interventions, health concerns, lunch status, transportation arrangement, contact information.
- Detailed academic instruction materials for each student must be submitted 24 hours in advance of placement.
- Students will be served by a teacher and a counselor or social worker.
- Students will adhere to their school code of conduct in addition to program specific expectations.
- “Rebound” staff will work collaboratively with school personnel if disciplinary problems occur that may require further action.
- Students will follow the ALOP DuPage calendar. On designated SIP days, it is the district’s discretion to send the student(s).
- Special education services will follow the student. Social work minutes may be provided by “Rebound” personnel.
- Access to technology is available to students.
- School personnel is encouraged to partner with the program’s interventions and goal setting by visiting students onsite.
- A re-entry conference at the district occurs per the SB 100 requirement *“...facilitate the re-engagement of students who are suspended out-of-school, expelled, or returning from an alternative school setting.”* (105 ILCS5/10-22.6 b-25)
- Funding for “Rebound” is provided through General State Aid and a tuition arrangement via an intergovernmental agreement.
