Dear Parents, Guardians, and Students:

I wanted to send an update regarding the start of Second Semester and everyone's least favorite topic...Covid protocols. While the CDC has issued new guidance regarding isolation for positive cases, as of now, none of it applies to schools in Illinois according to the IDPH and the Illinois State Board of Education. We anticipate this being a hot topic throughout the State over the course of the next couple of days and possibly into next week. So for now, our protocols for positive cases remain the same as the First Semester. If we are issued additional guidance, we will apply it, and update all of you. In all honesty, we want to be extra cautious the first few weeks back.

I'm asking for continued patience and support as we have returned to in-person learning this week. We all know that Covid numbers are very high and continue to fluctuate throughout DuPage County and surrounding counties as well. We continue to believe we can mitigate issues at school if we all work together. I'm asking everyone to please be kind to our teachers, social worker, front office staff, and myself, as we are attempting to do our very best to navigate the ever changing landscape that is COVID and the continual IDPH changes and updates, in order to ensure that our students and staff remain healthy.

I'm looking forward to starting our Second Semester together, and will continue to communicate as we carefully monitor Covid cases at the Center for Student Success.
